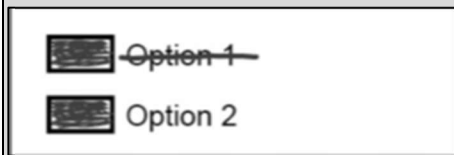
Use dark blue or black ink to fill in the box to the left of your choice.

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Where do Kitsap County voters stand on the 2026 initiatives?

Initiative Measure IP26-001 concerns parental rights relating to their children in public school.

This measure would repeal amendments to a statute listing certain rights of parents and guardians of public-school children and re-enact the law as it was originally enacted by Initiative to the Legislature 2081.

Should this measure be enacted into law? **YES**

13,499 Kitsap County voters signed this initiative

416,201 Washington State voters signed this initiative

Initiative Measure IL26-638 concerns participation in athletics at K-12 schools.

This measure would require policies prohibiting students it defines as ‘biologically male’ from competing with or against female students in certain interschool athletic activities that are intended for female students only.

Should this measure be enacted into law? **YES**

13,643 Kitsap County voters signed this initiative

445,187 Washington State voters signed this initiative

Initiative Measure IP26-645 concerns state and local taxes.

This measure would repeal a 9.9% tax on annual individual income over \$1,000,000; prohibit taxes measured by individual income and taxes on individual income or the receipt of individual income; and define ‘income.’ *This measure would decrease funding for public K-12 education, higher education (including universities and community colleges), and human services (primarily healthcare).*

Should this measure be enacted into law? **YES**

16,572 Kitsap County voters signed this initiative

511,408 Washington State voters signed this initiative

*The statement that this measure would “decrease funding” was written by state lawyers. Many argue that this statement inaccurate, since the state income tax is a future tax and is not paying for education and healthcare now. Decreased funding for these programs will not happen automatically if the state income tax is repealed.

Does your vote count? Why vote? You decide...

Below are some elections that were decided by **very small** margins:

2025 - North Mason School District #403, Prop 1 – Decided by **7 votes**

2024 - WA Commissioner of Public Lands – Decided by **51 votes**

2018 - 26th Legislative District State Senate – Decided by **104 votes**

2004 - Washington State Governor – Decided by **133 votes**
